Matthew 6:19-24

1. While this message was preached, an artist created a painting. At what point did the picture become clear to you? What was being communicated by the artist? What impression did it make on you?
2. Have you ever had something valuable eaten by a moth, rust, or stolen? Tell about it. Should it surprise you? How did it make you feel to lose that treasure?
3. Do you think God wants you to be rich? What do you think of preachers who promise wealth if you will send them money? Where does God want your treasure to be stored? How do you transfer treasure to Heaven?
4. A Wise investment strategy is to invest in that which will bring the greatest return over the longest period of time. If you want the greatest return over time where should you invest? Are you investing in an eternal fund? How rich will you be in Heaven?
5. Your heart always follows your treasure. If someone were to look at your last bank statement what would they conclude you have a heart for?
6. Most people would like to be more generous. What prevent generosity? How does the gaze of your eye affect what you do with the rest of your body? How does eye trouble prevent generous giving?
7. Which of the following orders of priority do you most often follow?
 - a. Spend, Save, Give
 - b. Give, Save, Spend
8. Read Proverbs 3:9-10. What is the proper order of giving? Do you give the Lord leftovers?
9. Whatever your eyes makes its treasure will demand payment with your life. Are there treasures that are slowly making you pay with our life? What are they?
10. Read 2Cor. 8:9. What did it cost Jesus to make you his treasure? Ultimately, a failure in generosity is a failure to believe the gospel. How does gazing at the cross produce a heart of generosity? What changes do you need to make in your giving as a result of gazing on the generosity of Christ?
